Perhaps some of you may be asking, “*What can I do to help keep our local taxes at a reasonable level?*” “*How can I make the Borough some money?*” Well, one way is to **recycle anything and everything possible**; including newspaper, cardboard, plastics, glass, cans, etc. Just in April, the residents of the Borough recycled 36.86 tons of material! Besides saving up to thousands of dollars each month in trash dumping fees, as well as saving the environment and our precious natural resources, the State of New Jersey through the Clean Communities Program pays towns money based on their level of recycling. In 2009, Surf City received a total of \$7,396.35. Okay, It is not a lottery jackpot, but it is some revenue for the town to which you can easily make a contribution and have a positive impact.
